



MAKE UP

I do like dancers to wear make-up for the show. Meaning, a little eyeshadow, blush, and bright red lipstick to give the girls some color. Stage lights are bright and students without makeup will not stand out on stage. Faces tend to get the “washed out” look with bright lights.

Applying makeup on your child is the parents’ choice and responsibility if they so choose to do so. We understand that some parents are not comfortable with the idea of children wearing make-up, please be assured that it truly is part of the costume.

(Similar to Halloween we wouldn’t send out our kitty cats without whiskers & a nose) It is for stage effects and most participants enjoy putting on dress-up makeup like mommy.

You may consider **BODY GLITTER or GLITTER HAIRSPRAY** as a wonderful addition and make them feel so very special.



HAIR STYLE

All dance students’ hair should be pulled back from off their face in a bun or updo hairstyle. **TRICK** - wet and gel your dancers hair **PRIOR** to putting in a ponytail or bun. Use bobby pins to secure any loose hair.

Costume hair accessories/pieces should be placed on the left side of your child’s head. Hair should be securely bobby-pinned and sprayed with hair spray after your costume hair accessory is put in place.
